

### Blessed is She

*"In all circumstances, hold faith as a shield, to quench all [the] flaming arrows of the evil one. // Ephesians 6:16*

*Spiritual battle is a part of the Christian life. If you are seeking and sincerely following Jesus, you will likely be able to discern more quickly when spiritual battle is taking place inside your soul. I am coming to understand more and more the power of one of the most important weapons in this battle: fearlessness. Scripture is brimming with the exhortation "do not be afraid" and yet we often fail to realize that this lack of fear is a massive defense for our souls.*

*Rooted in confidence // When we are not afraid, in the biblical sense, what we really proclaim is our confidence in God. We know that, as His children, there is nothing that can separate us from Him except our turning away from Him. When we choose fearlessness, then, we turn to Him with greater fervor. Because the reality is that we cannot be fearless on our own. There is much in life that overwhelms and threatens to crush us. We cannot be brave by our own might. We must rely completely on Him. Thus, being fearless in Christ necessitates utter dependence on Him and an unshakeable confidence that He will give us the grace.*

*Untouchable in trust // Fearlessness is so powerful in the spiritual battle because it is a proclamation of our great trust in Jesus. We know that He works all things together for our good. To be fearless means to trust. And radical trust is a stronghold.*

*Rightly ordered // Finally, fearlessness reminds us that we are not made for this world but for Heaven. While we are living in the world we are not attached to it; while we serve here we know our ultimate rest is There. To be fearless means that this life is not the final word.*

*Friends, whatever you are facing today, I am praying for this grace of fearlessness in your life. We cannot do it on our own, and I am asking Jesus to give us all the grace of unwavering confidence and total trust in His merciful love.*
